The objectives of the event:

- To facilitate exchange of experiences among actors from the corporate accountability, health & development NGOs and academic communities concerned about how to protect policy and programme spaces from undue corporate and other problematic influences;
- To increase their knowledge on conflict of interest (CoI) and related theories, in particular institutional corruption/corrosion theory;
- To strengthen capacity of these actors to raise more effectively CoI issues and to publicly argue for more appropriate CoI safeguards, with focus on nutrition and health arena.

Format of the event: Presentations by invited legal and health professional experts on Conflicts of Interest who will examine, among other topics: the *psychology* of conflicts of interest; how to stimulate/raise the Col debate in the medical community; risk areas for problematic conflicts of interest; corporate influence on standard setting; sponsorship by corporate and venture philanthropies; funding of research and setting of research agenda; close relations with corporate actors under the *"partnership"/"stakeholder"/"non-state actor"* paradigm & label; further alliance and capacity building.

Presentations will be followed by questions and free discussion on conflicts of interest issues brought up by the audience. In order to encourage free discussion the media will not be invited.
